Ponderings

At this time of year our diocese typically announces ‘priest personnel changes’ ---effective July 1st. The bishop is ultimately the ‘director of priest personnel’ in a diocese. Often, he will have a priest who will assist him in this important work. It is the bishop’s responsibility to maintain the pastoral care of the people in a diocese---and a key ingredient is to ensure that there is a pastor for those same people. This has become an increasingly challenging part of any bishop’s ‘job’ as bishop. And why is that? There are a few contributing factors. The first is that we are not ordaining the same number of men who are retiring in a given year. There is a deficit. This year, for example, we will have six priests retiring from active ministry and we are ordaining two new priests. The math is not good. In addition, we had one priest become a bishop; another priest is going to join the staff of a seminary; a third priest is working---for a time---for the military archdiocese; another priest died as pastor; another priest is taking a temporary medical leave of absence. How is a bishop to handle such a ‘deficit’ situation when it comes to staffing? He can bring in some priests from other countries to help our parishes---we presently have priests from Asia, Africa, South and Central America and Europe who are helping in parishes in our diocese on either a temporary or permanent basis. In addition, the ongoing work of pastoral planning will identify parishes that could be closed or merged with another parish. Several parishes that once had a ‘second priest’---an assistant pastor, no longer have that luxury.

One obvious and yet challenging solution is to recruit greater numbers of men to enter the seminary. A renewal of our vocation ministry is important. We need to promote a culture of vocations in our parishes and schools. I worked in ‘seminary formation’ for more than 10 years of my priesthood. I witnessed families that were very supportive of their son’s vocation to the priesthood, and some families that offered little or no support. It is a changing culture that surrounds us and our best efforts to recruit and prepare priests for the future of the church is no easy task.

An organization named “Vocation Ministry” offers workshops and training programs for dioceses and parishes to promote a culture of vocations to the priesthood and religious life. They conducted a survey not long ago and discovered that only 30 of 175 dioceses in the U.S. ordained an average number of priests at or above replacement level over the five years from 2016-2021. In other words, the number of priests retiring equaled the number of newly ordained. Their report entitled, “Creating a Culture of Vocations” analyzes vocations trends and makes recommendations on how to improve the ability of parishes and dioceses to foster vocations to the priesthood. From 2014-2021, the report finds, there was a 9% decrease in active diocesan priests, a 14% decrease in active religious order priests, a 22% decline in the number of seminarians and a 24% decline in total priestly ordinations per year.

Interestingly, another data point about prospective priests from the report: about 75% of newly ordained priests said their call to the priesthood first came before age 18. The director of the report said, “This when they are in catechism class, the parochial school, youth choir, serving at the altar and receiving the sacraments.”

Vocation trends differ in various parts of the United States. Parishes in the Northeast and upper Midwest are experiencing more of a decline in seminarians and priestly ordinations. The parish population in these regions is growing older---as are the physical buildings that often need much maintenance.

While we cannot single handedly ‘turn around’ the current vocation trend, we can make our best effort to be encouraging and supportive of potential seminarians, we can pray for vocations, we can be part of a culture that promotes vocations---we can be positive when we speak about vocations---who knows? family members, parishioners, and others just might be entertaining the possibility of priesthood.

Update on the “Memorials” for our 150th Anniversary

Trees: The ten trees have been planted. Our “watering teams” have been faithfully watering the trees on Tuesdays and Thursdays. Signs were ordered and have arrived with the name of the person ‘memorialized’.

Vestments: These have been ordered. Since most of them are coming from Europe it is difficult to gage their arrival time! Cloth tags with the name of the person ‘memorialized’ will be sewn in to the inside collar of the vestments.

Altar cloth: A new altar cloth arrived a few months ago. We have been using it. We now will attach the ‘memorial tag’ with the name of the person ‘memorialized’.

Liturgical items/candle sticks. Two different sets of candle sticks have arrived. They will be blessed soon and we will start using them. The free-standing candle sticks will go on the sides of the altar. The ‘triple candles’ will be used for the period of Adoration on Tuesday mornings.

Liturgical items/ciboria: The ciboria have arrived from Spain. They were engraved here in the US. We will bless those soon and begin using them.

Liturgical items/chalice: This is ‘on order’ from Europe. We do not have an estimated time of arrival!

Restored Stations of the Cross: Work on these is almost complete. We will have them ‘professionally hung’ in the corridors in the parish center; the conference rooms and the parish hall.

Funeral Set: Three matching white chasubles and a pall for the casket (all with a lightweight fabric) are on order.

Statue: The Marian Statue (The Bruges Madonna By Leonardo DaVinci) that will be in the ‘circle’ in the front of the church, has arrived from Italy and is in storage. We are working with our landscaper on the design of the stone base.


