Ponderings

Recently a movie was released entitled, “Bonhoeffer”. It is about the life of Dietrich Bonhoeffer. I’m not sure how many people have heard of him---but I thought I would write about him in this week’s column. I first learned about him many years ago when I read one of his best known books entitled, The Cost of Discipleship. Bonhoeffer was a German Lutheran pastor and theologian. He staunchly resisted the Nazi dictatorship, including some very vocal opposition to Adolf Hitler.

Bonhoeffer was born on February 4, 1906 in Breslau, Germany (now Poland) into a large family. He had a twin sister, Sabine. She and Dietrich were the sixth and seventh children out of eight. His father, Karl, was a psychiatrist and neurologist and his mother, Paula, was a teacher. His brother Walter, the second born of the family was killed in action during World War I when Dietrich was just 12 years old.

At the age of 14 he decided to pursue his education in theology, in spite of the criticism of his older brother Klaus (a lawyer) and Karl (a scientist). He began his studies at the university in Tubingen and eventually moved to the university in Berlin. At the age of 21 he went on to complete his Doctor of Theology degree from Humboldt University of Berlin.

In 1930, Dietrich moved to America with the intent of attaining a Sloan Fellowship at New York City’s Union Theological Seminary. During his time in America he met Frank Fischer, a black seminarian who introduced him to the Abyssinian Baptist Church in Harlem, where Bonhoeffer taught Sunday school and formed a lifelong love for the African-American church. He learned of the atrocities of war and began to value the views of pacifism because of the high value he placed on every individual life.

After returning to Germany in 1931 he became a lecturer in systematic theology at the University of Berlin. On November 15, 1931 at the age of 25 he was ordained a Lutheran minister.

The rise of the Nazi party changed his life. He was a determined opponent of the regime. Two days after Hitler was installed as chancellor, Bonhoeffer delivered a radio address in which he attacked Hitler and warned Germany against slipping into an idolatrous cult of the ‘fuhrer’. Many of the German churches favored Hitler, and so Bonhoeffer was at odds with them as well. In August 1933, Bonhoeffer and Hermann Sasse were deputized by opposition church leaders to draft the “Bethel Confession” as a statement of faith in opposition to the German churches aligned with Hitler.

In 1933 when he was offered a parish post in eastern Berlin he refused it and instead accepted a two-year appointment as a pastor of two German speaking Protestant churches in London. In 1935 he became head of an underground seminary in Finkenwalde for training new pastors (resisting the Nazis). In August 1936 Bonhoeffer’s authorization to teach at the University of Berlin was revoked after he was denounced as a ‘pacifist and enemy of the state’. In September 1937 the Gestapo closed the seminary in Finkenwalde and by November 27 pastors and former students were arrested. It was around this time that he published his best-known book, The Cost of Discipleship. He spent the next two years secretly traveling from one eastern German village to another to conduct a ‘seminary on the run’ supervising the continuing education and work of his students, most of whom were working illegally in small parishes.

In March 1940 the Gestapo shut down the underground seminary. In February 1938 he came in contact with members of the German resistance. War was approaching and he worried about being conscripted. He could never swear an oath to Hitler. In 1941 he was forbidden to print or publish anything. He served as a courier for the German resistance movement. He was arrested on April 5. For a year and a half he was imprisoned at Tegel Prison awaiting trial. He was sentenced to death on April 8, 1945 at a court-martial without witnesses, without any evidence against him and with no records of the proceeding or a defense. He was executed in Flossenbürg concentration camp by hanging on April 9.

I think it is a movie worth seeing.




