Ponderings

Much of the world was shocked on April 15, 2019 when a fire destroyed Notre Dame Cathedral in Paris. The chief architect of the newly rebuilt cathedral said of the destruction, “We had lost the framework, the roof, the spire and three sections of the vault.” The French president, Emmanuel Macron, vowed to rebuild it within five years. Mr. Villeneuve, the chief architect, as walked through the rubble of the 861-year-old structure saw a beacon of hope, “All the stained-glass windows were spared, the great organ, the furniture, the paintings---the paintings.”

It took 200 years to build Notre Dame and now the restoration was set to take place in a five-year period. There was tremendous worldwide support with donations from around the world approaching One Billion dollars. The intense heat and falling debris left behind a film of toxic lead dust, requiring meticulous cleaning of every surface. Sculptures, walls and organ pipes were painstakingly stripped of grime and soot, exposing a brightness unseen for centuries.

It is expected that fifteen million visitors will view the beautiful restoration----three million more than before the fire.

In reading about the restoration and the reopening of the cathedral not long ago, I came upon some “Notre Dame Cathedral Trivia” that I found interesting.

1. The Ile-de-la-Cite on which Notre Dame now sits was once a Gallio-Roman city known as Lutetia. The cathedral may have been built over the ruins of a temple. Around 1710, pieces of a sculpted altar dedicated to Jupiter and other deities was discovered evidence of an ancient temple. (or the pieces were recycled there from another location.)
2. Before the fire, the cathedral contained one of the oldest surviving wooden structures in Paris, involving around 52 acres of trees that were cut down in the 12th century. For this reason, the lattice of historic woodwork was nicknamed “the forest”.
3. The exterior flying buttresses were constructed around its nave in the 12th century to lend support to its thin walls, after the need for more light in the incredibly tall church’s large windows. There is debate over whether Notre Dame was the first church to have them, they have certainly set the trend for sacred architecture.
4. In 1793, in the midst of the French Revolution, 28 statues of biblical kings in the cathedral were pulled down with ropes and decapitated by a mob. It wasn’t until 1977 that the heads of these kings were discovered during work on the basement of the French Bank of Foreign Trade.
5. The bells were once melted down for artillery. All twenty of its bells were melted down to make cannons. The largest 1681 ‘bourdon’ was not touched. While the bells were restored in the 19th century, the new instruments were not as finely made as the older versions and made a more dissonant noise when clanging. Finally, in 2013, a new ensemble of bells restored the cathedral to its 17th century sound, with deeply resonant sound.
6. When Napoleon decided to have his 1804 coronation as emperor in Notre Dame the building was in bad shape. Centuries of decay as the city developed and changed around it, as well as the vandalism of the French Revolution, had left it on the verge of demolition. For years it had been used as little more than a warehouse. So, when Napoleon declared its return to church use, and hosted his grand ceremony within his walls, an event in which he famously crowned himself, it brought Notre Dame new prominence.

I did have the chance to visit Notre Dame on a trip to France many years ago (long before the fire!). It did make a great impact on me. Maybe one day I will get to see the restoration! Something else for my bucket list.....the long bucket list!
