Ponderings

One of the wonderful Catholic customs at this time of year is to put our “Nativity Set” in a prominent place for the family to enjoy---to gaze upon. Some nativity sets are made of plastic, some are made of wood (think Holy Land olive wood), some are made of ceramic, some are made of plastic (always a good idea when there are young children who like to grab things!). The nativity set, or creche, can be the focus of a prayerful gaze---and can become a means for us to enter into the stable---to be with Mary, Joseph, the tiny Christ child, the oxen and other animals, the shepherds, the angels, the wise men. Why not take a quiet moment---cup of tea in hand, to stare into the scene---offer a prayer of thanks---or simply ‘wonder’ at the Christmas miracle. After all is said and done, after the rushing around, after the entertaining, after the opening of gifts----it is really all about that tiny child, the Savior of the World, the Prince of Peace, the Son of God.

One of the most awaited “Nativity Set” unveilings is in St. Peter’s Square in Rome. During my years in Rome I always enjoyed walking into the square during the month of December to see the progress of setting up and eventually unveiling “this year’s nativity”. This year (2024) the nativity set was unveiled on December 7th. The scene was crafted by some 40 volunteers from Grado, a town of the Marano Lagoon (near Venice) at the northern tip of the Adriatic in the province of Gorizia. It depicts scenes from everyday life in the early 20th century, centered around the local fishermen, the ‘casoneri’ and their ‘casoni’, typical reed dwellings. Two ‘batele’, typical flat-bottomed boats, will float on a stream behind a 100-meter dike. The crib is adorned with ‘briccole’, signs indicating navigable canals to the cities of Aquileia, Trieste and Venice and to the Marian shrine of the Crowned Virgin of Barbana. The shrine dates back to 582 and is located on one of the lagoon’s islets, of which there are more than a hundred.

Mary, Joseph and the child Jesus are located inside one of the fishermen’s huts (casone). Among the figures molded by hand from the mire of the lagoon, is a fisherwoman who is leading the boat carrying the three wise men. This is the first time that the nativity scene features a large body of water. The replica lagoon features a beach, islands, boats, animals and representatives of the town.

Pope Francis, at the unveiling, said, “I greet the delegation from Grado, from whose territory the Nativity display in the center of the Square originates, and that of Ledro, from whose forests comes the imposing 29 meter high spruce tree.” He continues, “....in the shadow of the great spruce tree, the Nativity display reproduces the ‘casone’ of the lagoon of Grado, one of the fishermen’s houses that were built with mud and reeds and where the inhabitants of the ‘motes’, the small lagoon island, during the hard work of fishing, shared the joys and sufferings of everyday life. This symbol, too, speaks to us of Christmas, in which God becomes man in order to share in our poverty, coming to build his Kingdom on hearth not with powerful means, no, but through the weak resources of our humanity, purified and strengthened by his grace.”

In reference to the typical flat-bottomed boat used by the fishermen (batela)---he says it makes it possible to move over shallow waters. And the boat is needed to reach Jesus, too: the Church is the boat. One does not reach his ‘alone’—never—we reach him together, we reach him as a community, on the great little boat that Peter continues to lead and on which, huddling together a little, there is room for everyone.”

During my time in Rome there was a Nativity display from Malta that really impressed me----I’m sure I used the description of it in a Christmas homily! Enjoy the savoring of the Christmas season---by staring into your family’s creche.

Outreach to help the Poor.




